Three steps to find options and places to get help

Step 1: What's the problem?

I suddenly have no money

- · Lost job or reduced hours
- · Money stopped
- Lost money
- Unexpected expense

Step 2: What are some options?

Welsh Government and Council Support Schemes

The Welsh Government's Discretionary Assistance Fund can offer an Emergency Assistance Payment (EAP) to help with essential items, such as food, gas, electricity or clothing if you are experiencing significant financial hardship, or in a crisis situation and in need of immediate financial support. This grant can be paid into your bank account (BACS) or it can be awarded as a text message voucher sent to your mobile (PayPoint youcher).

People on low incomes of state pension age or in supported or temporary accommodation may be eligible for housing benefit. It may also be possible to apply for Discretionary Housing Payment and Council Tax Support. Otherwise it may be best to apply for Universal Credit to help with housing costs. This will depend on your current circumstances and whether you pay rent and/or Council Tax - for more details see 'Further Council Support' in Step 3.

Maximise Your Income

Anyone who is struggling financially can get a benefit check and speak to an advisor for free and confidential advice. A benefit check can ensure that you are receiving all the money you're entitled to, especially if your circumstances have changed recently. Speaking to an advisor could also help you manage things like your gas and electricity bills and make sure you're not missing out on things like free school meals.

Bebt Advice

Debt can happen to anyone. Free advice and support can help you find ways to manage your debts and reduce how much you pay each month.

Benefit Advance

If you have made a new claim for benefit and are in financial hardship while you wait for your first payment, you may be able to get an advance to afford things like rent or food. It's important to get advice before taking out an advance. Benefit advances must be paid back, and the money will be taken from your future benefit payments (a loan).

6 Hardship Payment

If you have been sanctioned by the DWP, you may be able to request a hardship payment from the Jobcentre. Hardship payments are not always paid immediately, and they're not available to everyone. Hardship payments of Universal Credit need to be paid back (a loan), but hardship payments of Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment Support Allowance do not (not a loan).

6 Challenge a Decision

You can challenge a benefit decision if your benefit has been stopped / sanctioned / reduced / refused or you have been overpaid. Most benefit decisions need to be challenged within one month; you may be able to make a late challenge.
