# **Council Support Schemes**

People on low incomes may be eligible for Housing Benefit, Discretionary Housing Payments and Council Tax Support from the council. This will depend on your current circumstances. Find out more at:

## **Maximise Your Income**

Anyone who is struggling financially can get a benefit check and speak to an advisor for free and confidential advice.

A benefit check can ensure that you are receiving all the money you're entitled to, especially if your circumstances have changed recently. Speaking to an advisor could also help with managing your gas and electricity bills and make sure you're not missing out on things like school clothing grants or free school meals.

## **Debt Advice**

Debt can happen to anyone. Free advice and support can help you find ways to manage your debts and reduce how much you pay each month.

## **Benefit Advance**

If you have made a new claim for benefit and are in financial hardship while you wait for vour first payment, you may be able to get an advance to afford things like rent or food. It's important to get advice before taking out an advance. Benefit advances must be paid back, and the money will be taken from your future benefit payments (a loan).

## **Hardship Payment**

If you have been sanctioned, you may be able to request a hardship payment from the Jobcentre. Hardship payments are not always paid immediately, and they're not available to everyone. Hardship payments of Universal Credit need to be paid back (a loan), but hardship payments of Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment Support Allowance do not (not a loan).

## **Challenge a Decision**

You can challenge a benefit decision if your benefit has been stopped / sanctioned / reduced / refused or you have been overpaid. Most benefit decisions need to be challenged within one month.
